Brighton Croquet Club 2025 Doubles Tournament

This event will be a paired high/low handicap single round, round-robin event played in a relaxed tournament style played throughout 2025.

The doubles pairs will be determined using handicap rankings. This pairing will be fixed for the event.

All entrants, based on handicap and index score, will be paired – highest with lowest, second highest with second lowest etc. etc.

Entrants' names will be placed on a typical tournament grid.

The players will arrange their own games – on Tuesdays and Thursday mornings by using the 'player board' to co-ordinate playing through the list of opponents. Alternatively, play may be arranged at other times, that suits the pairings.

This event will run from February to December.

Each game is 45 minutes, walk off on the bell and 'draws' may occur and count.

IMPORTANT NOTE FOR MEMBERS

Care of Hoop Holes

The hoop hole is intended to hold the hoop firmly in position and when first used they were extremely solid. If the hoop became loose during play as a result of being hit in attempts to run the hoop, then they were tightened by hammering in a bit further. We alternate between north and south holes to avoid "rabbit runs" and rest the hoop holes.

Putting hoops in and out of the holes inevitably causes wear of the hole and many hoops were loose. Grass cuttings are used to try and tighten up the holes, but this has resulted in these falling to the bottom of the hole and becoming extremely hard as the hoop is hammered in. It is so hard that the plugs we use to cover the unused hoop holes have been bent and/or driven in so hard that the plastic caps have come free leaving the shaft stuck in the hoop hole. These can be very difficult to remove.

I have drilled the hoop holes so that the plugs can be inserted and removed easily, and the holes have been refurbished to minimise movement. So, the key things for members are:

- Treat the holes with care. Do not wobble the hoops to remove them.
- Don't use your foot or mallet to try and hit the hoop in further.
- If you can't pull them straight out use the lifters on the equipment trolleys.
- Use pea straw or Sphagnum Moss to put in the hoop holes to tighten a loose hoop or refer that hoop to me.
- Do not use lawn clippings.
