These tournaments do not run themselves and I would like to thank everyone who had any part in making this a very successful day.





Brighton Croquet Club History Matters: Episode 7

Location, Location

Enjoying the excellent facilities at the Brighton Sports Complex means a big thank-you is due to Howard Wood for his untiring input into what must be one of the outstanding croquet court surfaces in Australia. Members who have read one of the two Club histories (residing in our modest bookcase) will know though that our Club was once located elsewhere. Our former home was at the corner of Keelara Street and Torr Avenue, and you will be very surprised if you mosey along to that site now and marvel at the tiny piece of turf remaining there. A larger site there, such a bold purchase in 1917, was due to an enterprising effort by a group - all women in those days - who sought a lasting home base after first playing on a tract of land just south of St Judes church on Brighton Road.

The purchased tract of land was though to suffer a series of shrinkages. Firstly the creation of Mott Terrace between the Croquet and Tennis Club's land and the railway line which had the purpose of linking Keelara Street with Jetty Road. This action removed a significant 12 metre strip of the neighbouring Club's land - then that was later followed by the rounding of the corner of Keelara Street and Mott Terrace, which caused some further loss of Croquet Club land. After that came a widening of Keelara Street in 1942 which further shaved off some of our land leaving the site reduced to just one and a bit croquet courts.

By the 1970s however the Brighton Club membership was moving in the opposite direction and in 1996 the strength was over 90 members. The Club repeatedly approached the then Brighton Council for a better venue during the 1980s for relief of its plight, but no satisfactory result came until 1994. The Club's land was sold to the Council, leaving a very large amount to be raised to purchase our present site and then furnish it with a Clubhouse and lay down three playing courts. The Club ultimately took up residence at its present site in 1997.

Much more recently, good fortune occurred in the lead-up to the recent Federal Election when in Sports-rort style the Brighton sporting hub, being fortuitously located in the politically marginal Electorate of Boothby, was given a huge make-over. Our Club benefited from the addition of an attractive logo positioned over the front door, a re-paint of the Clubhouse in the traditional Brighton colours of Black and Yellow and the fencing alongside the eastern edge of Court One, replaced.
