Brighton Croquet Club History Matters: Episode 10

GENDER ISSUES

The Holdfast Bay Club situated to the north of us was originally titled 'Glenelg' and it is known that as early as 1919, that Glenelg welcomed all-comers who wanted to play croquet. It is also known that in 1926 approximately 1000 women were registered Statewide with SACA but only 30 men. In 1939 the SACA President lamented in a Press interview that too few men played croquet, and she opined that "Men would, I think, tend to improve the standard, as they would, perhaps, adopt more forceful tactics". The 'Association' game (much more popular in those times than 'Golf' croquet), for many years was sullied by a negative unadventurous type of play, disparagingly referred to as "Aunt Emma" tactics.

Brighton Croquet Club, in 1949 after 44 years of existence only welcomed women as members - but change was in the air! The Club Captain at the time seconded a motion put at a Special General Meeting "that men, be accepted as members of the Club". This did not go down at all well with some senior figures and so a cautious amendment to the motion was moved "that such membership be limited to six, until the end of the year". This was then followed by another Motion "that ladies only, hold office as it is a Ladies Club". Next month four men were accepted as members.

This ground-breaking occurrence seemed to have led to some unsettling developments, as just one week later, a Special Committee Meeting was held, at which it was decided to send a letter to a particular member "asking for an apology to the Captain, and also for more co-operation and less fault-finding on the lawns". A Special General Meeting followed to hear from both aggrieved parties, and it was decided by a unanimous vote to cancel that member's membership and to refund her six months fee.

In the following year the Committee drew up a set of Club Rules, within which there was no mention of restrictions on the number of male members. For the following decades women clearly continued to prevail in both membership numbers and as key office-bearers despite a steady increase in male memberships. Parity between the genders eventually occurred in 1966. Club records are scarce there-abouts, but we do know that in 1972 a man, Dennis Hassell was elected Club President, Charles Allport was elected Treasurer four years later, and popular Rod Kerr elected Secretary in 1987, but it was not until 2006 that a man, David Greig was elected as Club Captain.

These days, Wendy Williamson is doing an excellent job as Club President and the position of Secretary is more than ably filled by busy Jackie Sutherland whilst Jon Trenwith handles the office of Treasurer. Then of course we have other hard workers - Howard, Sonya, Marlene etc, etc....

What a lovely Club we belong to now!
